


# Shopify Feeder

This guide will show you how to use the Shopify Feeder to automatically import products from your website.

Start by going to the Feeder tab, then click New Feeder and select Shopify.

You'll also need to log into your Shopify admin portal, so make sure you have both open back in Q2U.


Enter your Shop domain, which is your website address.

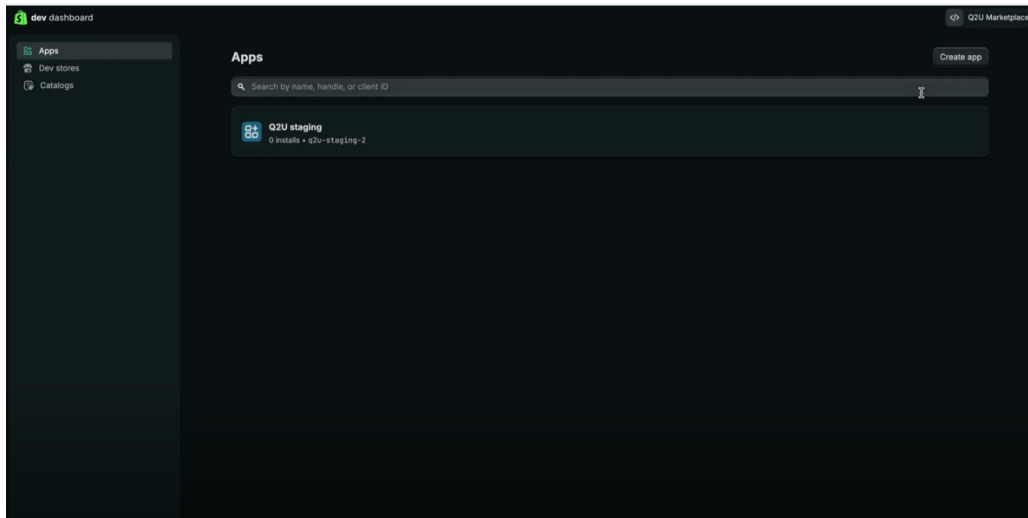
Now switch to Shopify.

Click the menu in the top right corner, then open the Developer dashboard.

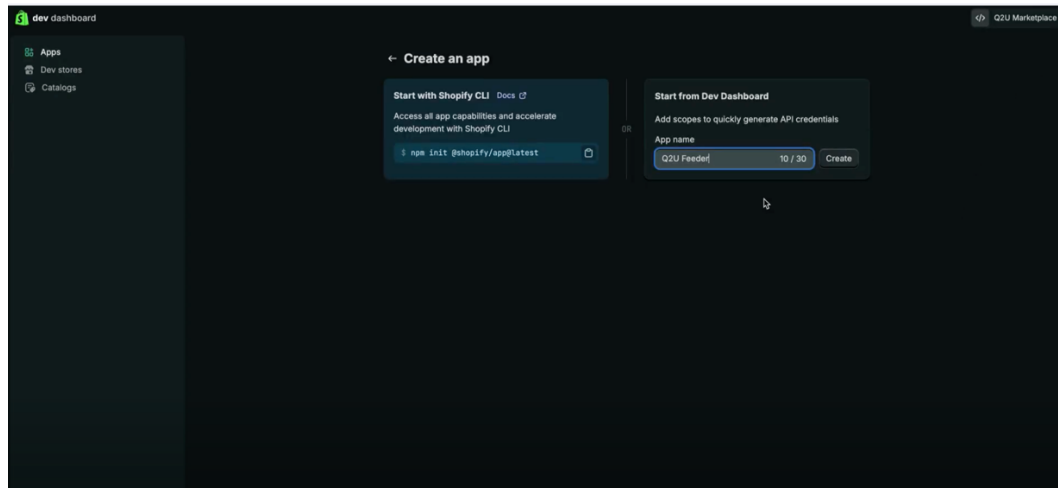

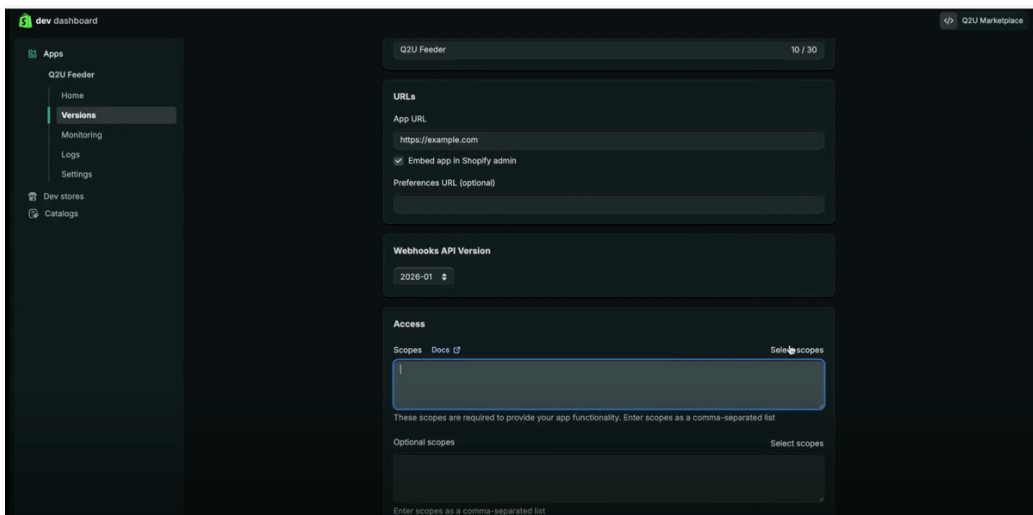
Once it loads, click Create App.



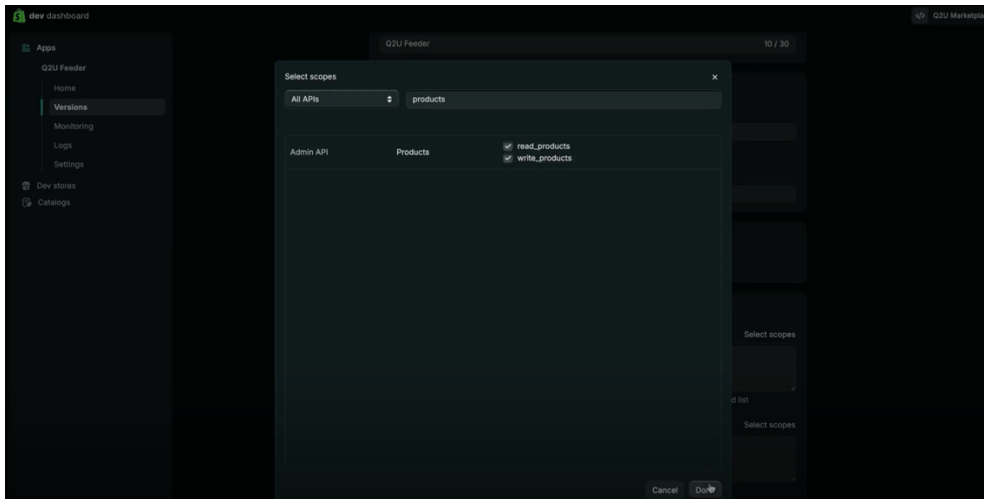
Enter an app name in the Start from Dev Dashboard section, then click Create.



Scroll down to the Access section.

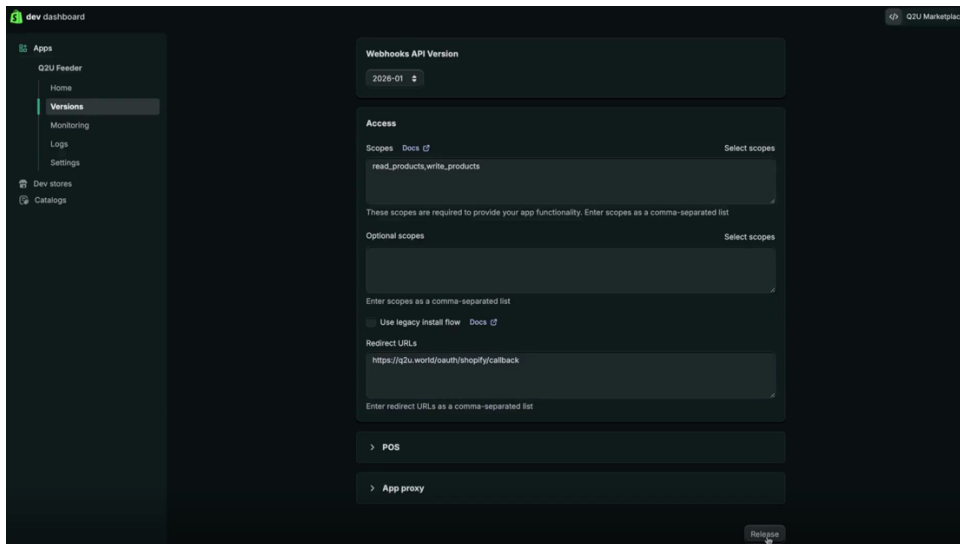


Click Select Scopes, Search for Products, then Enable Read Products and Write products, and click Done.

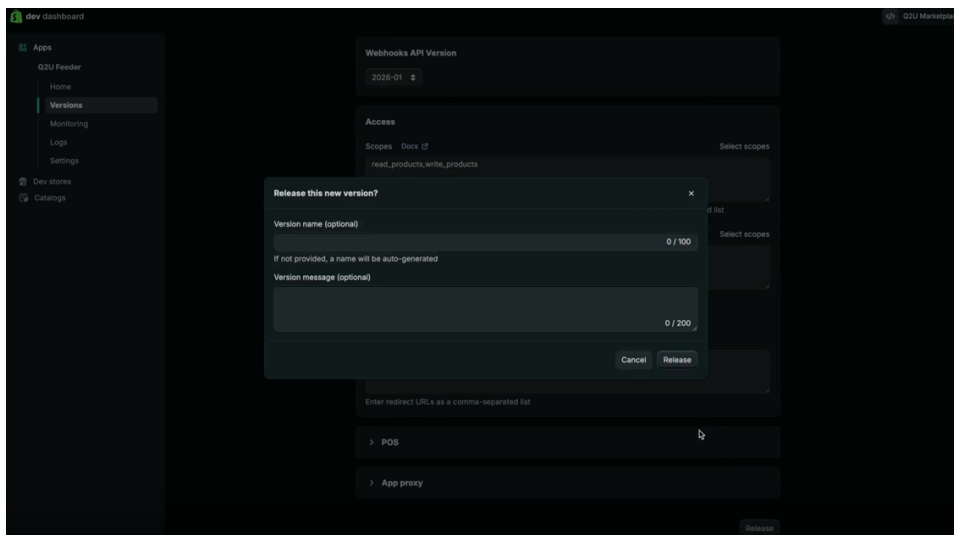


Next, enter the redirect URL, which is <https://q2u.world/oauth/shopify/callback>

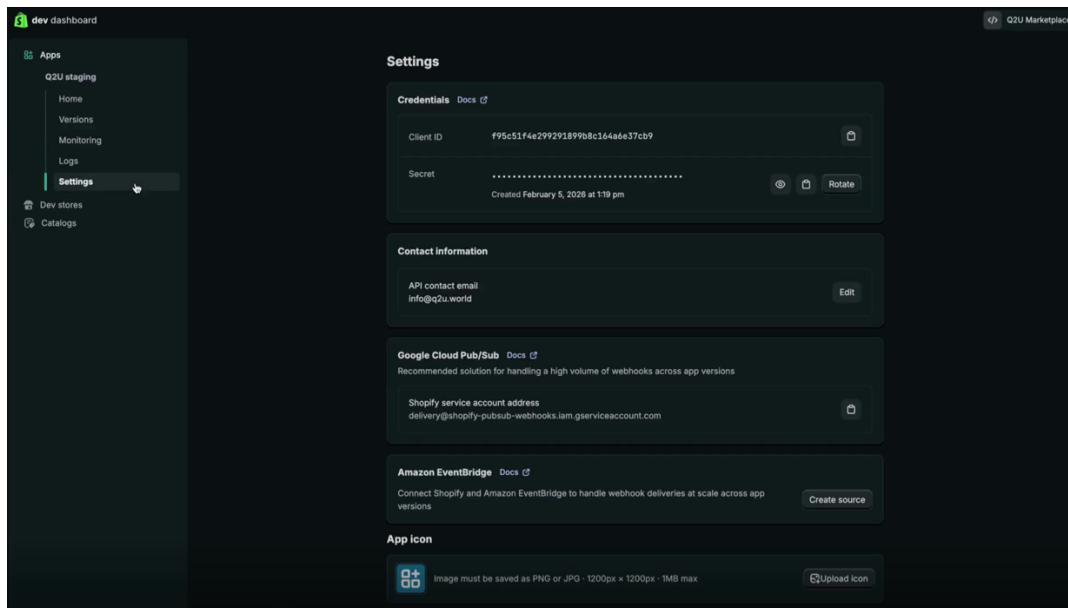
Click Release.



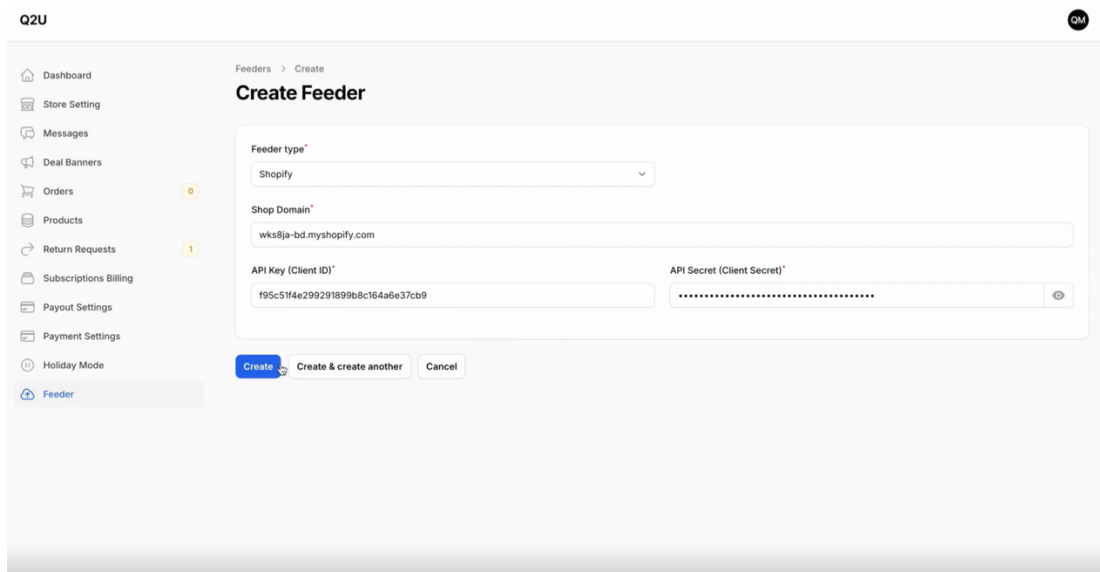
You can add an optional release name and description or click Release again to continue.



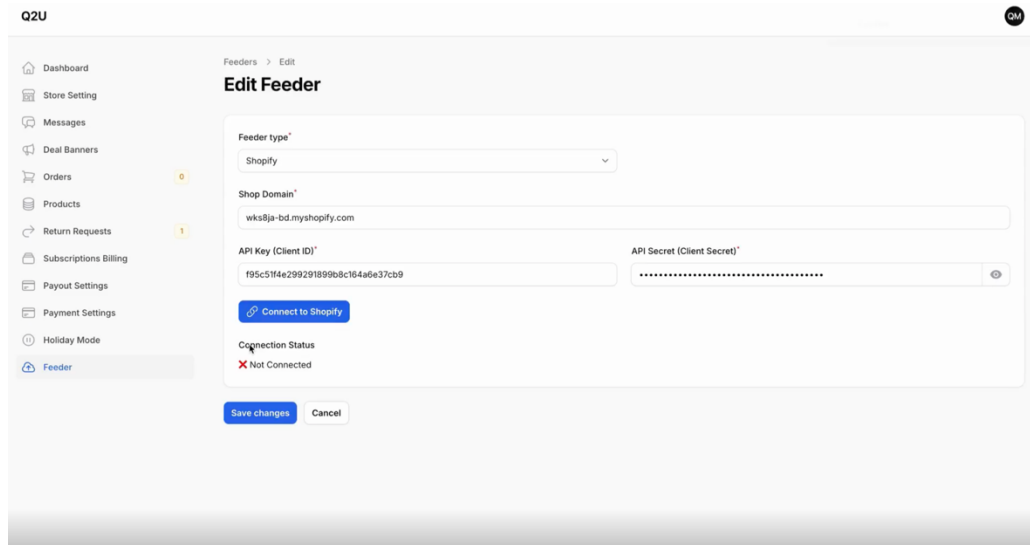
You'll now be taken to the Versions page.  
From here, go to Settings, where you'll find your client ID and client secret.



Copy both values and paste them into the matching fields in the Q2U feeder.  
Then click Create.

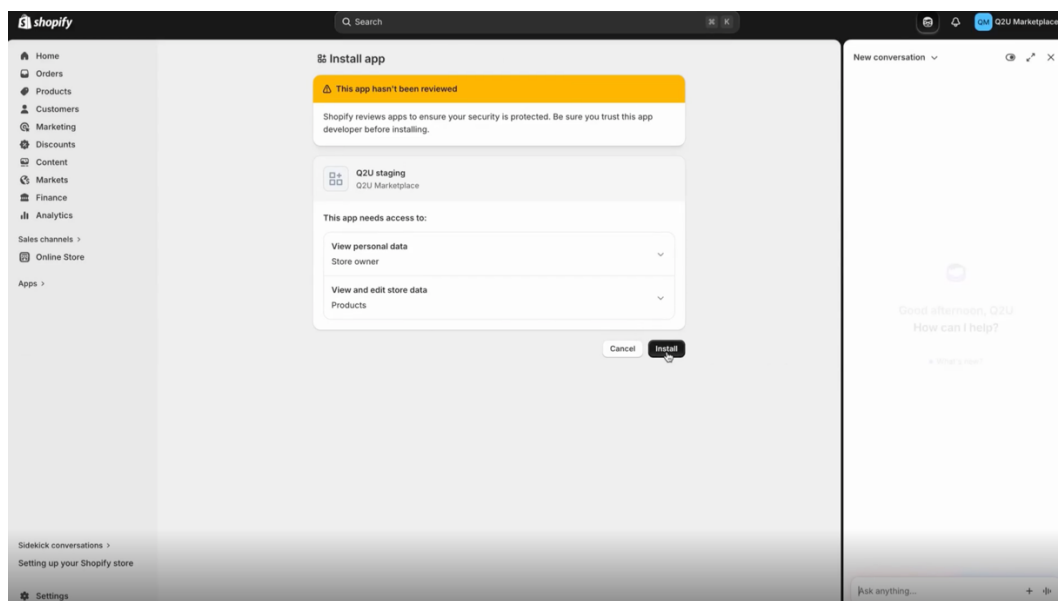


Next, click Connect to Shopify.



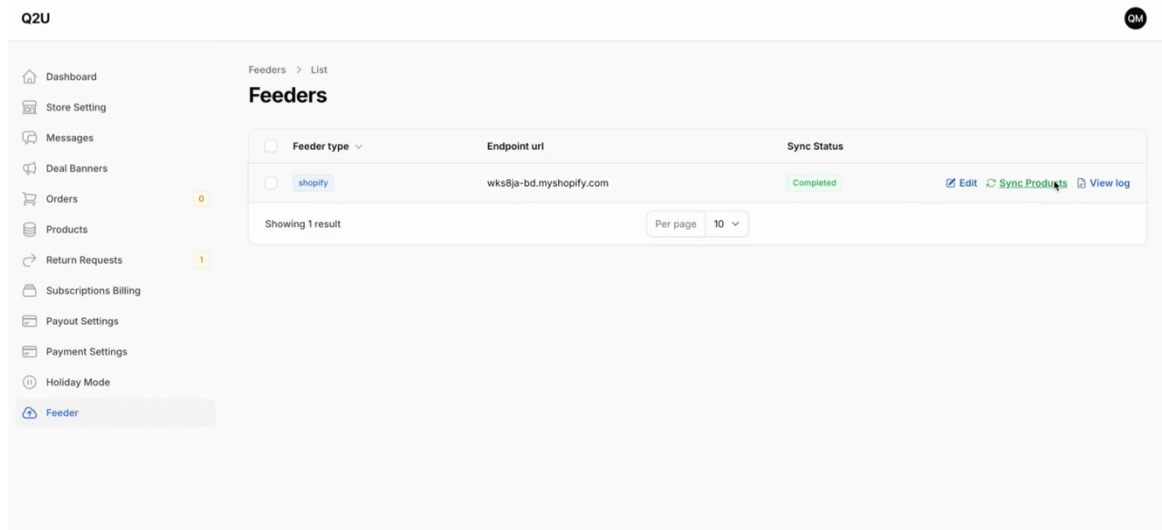
You'll be redirected to your Shopify Apps page.

Click Install to add the app to your store and allow product syncing.



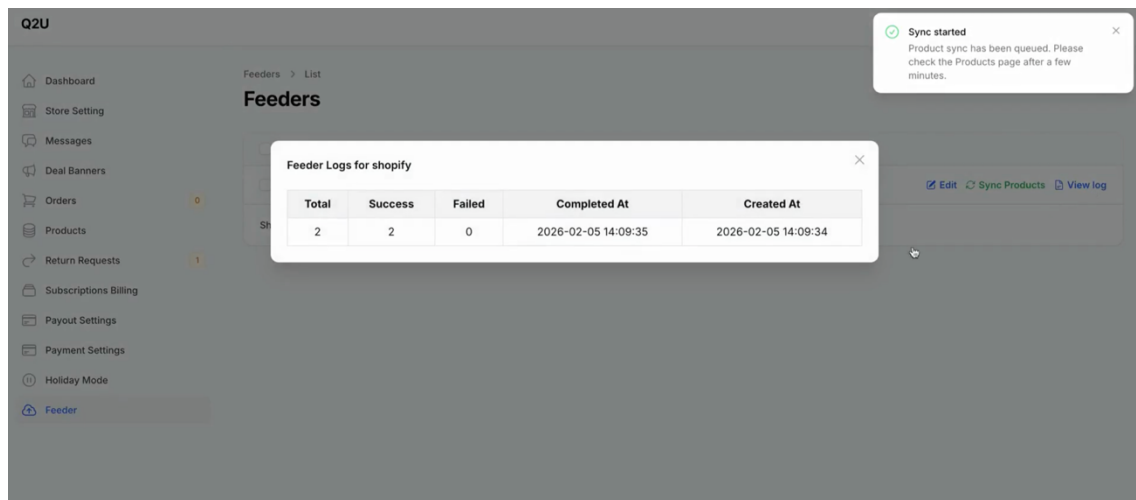
You'll then be taken back to Q2U.

Go to Feeder, click Sync Products, press confirm and the import will begin.



This may take a few minutes depending on how many products you have.

You can click view log to see the import results.



If any products appear as draft, it means some details are missing and you'll need to update them before making those products active.
